#### ST. JOHN'S STEWARDSHIP CAMPAIGN MESSAGE

Dear Friends and Members of St. John's UCC,

During the month of November, we will be conducting a stewardship campaign. Each Sunday during the month, a member of our congregation will be giving a personal statement about what St. John's means to them and why they think it is important to support the church financially. During this time, and by no later than November 26, you will be asked to return a pledge card indicating your estimate of 2024 giving. We will use this information to prepare the 2024 budget.


In the last decade, we have had only two years of surplus income over budgeted expenses. This has occurred even though during that same period of time our actual expenses have every year been lower than the budget approved at the annual congregational meeting. We have also had two separate occasions where we discussed finances with the congregation and asked for a vote on whether or not we should go to a part-time pastor in order to reduce our annual expenses. Both times, the congregation voted to maintain a full-time pastor.

We recognize that every family has multiple demands on its financial resources. Our goal this year is to have you think about the importance of your church to you and your family's well-being. Even though we don't DEMAND your support, we certainly NEED it. We cannot pay the salaries of our pastor, secretary, and music director, pay the utility bills or maintain our building and equipment without your support. We are asking that you consider what St. John's means to you, and how you are able to support it financially, then to make a commitment of financial support. Then we count on you to honor your commitment. If you make a pledge to give X dollars per week, that means we count on those funds even in the weeks you aren't in church.

We do not want you to feel that we are engaging in arm-twisting or financial bullying. We are asking that you prayerfully consider the amount you have been giving and ask yourself if you can find a way to increase that amount.

This church has a long history of rising to meet the need. We ask that you continue that tradition. Thank you for your support of St. John's UCC.


#### ANNUAL COMMUNITY THANKSGIVING SERVICE
