#### Contact Your Representatives

The pace of change in our federal government is accelerating and causing tremendous anxiety for many of us. The right to petition our government is one of our basic freedoms enshrined in the Bill of Rights. #### Renewable Energy in America is on the Rise!

In 2024, In a staggering statistic, where it took a whole year to add one gigawatt of solar power in 2004, it now takes one single day. A gigawatt can power around 200,000 homes in the US. Indeed, 90% of all grid additions in 2024 were renewable energy sources, including solar, wind, biomass, hydro, and geothermal.



Solar accounted for 80% of all these additions alone, providing 30 gigawatts of electricity, or around 75% of the total renewable energy supply California has installed in the state's history. New solar capacity added in 2024 is almost nine times that added by natural gas and nuclear power combined. There was also a respectable amount of capacity added by new wind power installations, which added 3 gigawatts to state grids. Additionally, 213 megawatts of hydropower, 51 MW of biomass, and 29 MW of geothermal steam were added, taking the total renewable energy footprint in 2024 to 90.5% of all new power sources. Solar's share of US generating capacity is now 10x greater than a decade ago, and renewables have inched up beyond 30% of the total grid mix.

## Lay School

SONKA, our local Association of the United Church of Christ, has reinstituted the Lay School. Now entirely online, the Lay School is a multi-year series of courses covering basic theological and spiritual aspects of the Christian faith as understood within the UCC. Generally, two courses are taught in the Spring and two in the Fall. All courses are open to anyone interested in these subjects. It is not necessary to take the courses in any particular order. There is a fee for each course with assistance available for those in special need.

Beyond the advantage of learning more about the faith, the Lay School is an excellent path to ministry in the UCC for those who cannot attend traditional seminary. Completion of the three-year cycle of courses can serve as a basis for a person looking to enter into lay or ordained ministry in the UCC.

Beginning this March, the Lay School will offer a course in Introduction to Christian Scriptures taught by our pastor, Mark Anthony, and a course on Faith Formation, taught by Rev. Ruth Hopkins. If you want more information, please contact Pastor Mark.
