In observance of Earth Day this week, there is good news concerning the Earth's environment to share. Boyan Slat, founder of The Ocean Cleanup, devised a method to clean up the Great Pacific Garbage Patch, a floating island of plastic garbage twice the size of Texas.




Vessels tow a barrier forward, allowing it to sweep a large area and move methodically through the water. Mesh attached to the barrier gathers plastic and guides it to a retention area, where it would be extracted and loaded onto a ship for sorting, processing, and recycling. The barrier measures almost 2.5 kilometers - or about 1.5 miles - in length, and it cleans up an area of the ocean the size of a football field every five seconds. The system is designed to be safe for marine life, and once plastic is brought to land, it is recycled into new products, like sunglasses and accessories for electric vehicles. Ocean Cleanup predicts that the Garbage Patch will be cleaned up within five years.
